A Year of Celebration: 20 Years of Christ Lutheran Church's Chartering



In the November 2, 1990 issue of the *Crossville Chronicle* we find the following:

"Starting as a mission two years ago, Christ Lutheran Church will celebrate the occasion of its formal organization as a congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) on Sunday, November 4."

Certainly much effort and prayer preceded this date. We could have been celebrating 20th anniversaries of the various steps along the road to becoming an official congregation for the last two or three years!

In Volume I of our Church Archives, we read that The first proposal to start a new mission church at Fairfield Glade was made in December, 1985. However, due no doubt in part to the distraction of church officials with the process of the denominational merger that created the ELCA in 1987, approval to begin developing the new church did not occur until 1987 for a 1988 start date. With that approval, and a small start-up contribution from the Synod, the first worship service was held on July 24, of that year.

In recognition of the significance of this 20th Anniversary of the official chartering of the congregation, we will be lifting up key moments in our history throughout the year, culminating in a 20th Anniversary Homecoming celebration on the weekend of November 5 - 7.

I am honored to serve as your pastor during this momentous year in the life of your church as you not only celebrate the accomplishments of the last 20 years but also look forward to the next 20 years of ministry.

For January, we offer the following notice from the January, 1990 *Cumberland County Times*:

"This Sunday, January 14, marks a special day in the history of Christ Lutheran Church as they celebrate "Charter Sunday." This was held to take the next step toward officially establishing the congregation. Christ Lutheran Church is a mission under the sponsorship of the ELCA, and any persons feeling they would like to be included as Charter Members are invited to come forth at this time."

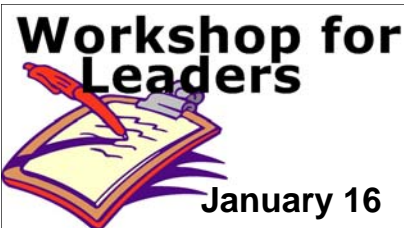

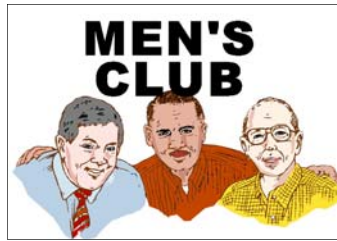
On Saturday, January 16, from 9:30 a.m. till 3:30 p.m., Pastor Fred Milligan will be leading the "Ventures in

Items needed include: peanut butter, jelly, macaroni and cheese, Ramen Noodles (soup), spaghetti sauce, pasta, dry beans, rice, cereal, as well as canned potatoes, beans, meat and fish, toilet paper, paper towels, Styrofoam plates and bowls, 16 oz. plastic cups, 13 & 39 gallon trash bags, freezer storage bags (quart & gallon), aluminum foil, dish soap, and all-purpose cleaners.

We will be serving lunch again at the Bread of Life Rescue Mission on January 10 and would appreciate your support. This is a great opportunity to get involved in local mission work without the risk of overexerting or overextending yourself. The meal will be served at 12:30 P.M. and we will be cleaned up and on our way well before 2 P.M. Please see the sign-up sheet posted on the Service Bulletin Board. If, by chance, that doesn't suit you or all the above requirements have been filled, sign-up to join us at the Mission to serve the meal (limited to three people because of the small kitchen).

HOW I WAS BLESSED AT MISSION MAZAHUA



This was the second year that I had been invited and recruited by Bill to join his mission to Mexico up in the mountains with a medical team. The first year just did not work out with my schedule. Bill made me promise that I would go in 2009. I couldn't seem to wiggle out of it. I am a retired physical therapist and my expertise was needed. I could not see how one week of “physical therapy” could help anyone in a far away poor country.

My very first blessing came the first day, when I was asked to evaluate a young child who, with his mother, had come to the hacienda seeking help. The child was in a baby carriage hardly visible

because he was all bundled up. His name was Lois Angel; he was four years old and the first and only child of the most lovely mother with a gentle, caring demeanor. I asked, through my interpreter Angie, if we could go somewhere quiet where I could get Lois Angel out of his carriage and on a bed. We went to the Special Friends dorm and found a lower bunk bed. It seemed to me that there we were: the three mothers—one mother, the interpreter, who had for the first time come from Texas to visit her paraplegic son who had found a place to have value at the mission, one mother who had brought her baby with hope in her heart that someone could do something to help him, and one mother who has been blessed all her life with health, healthy children, and wealth—we were kneeling by the lower bunk bed adoring this sweet child. I was told that Lois Angel was a normal birth child until he was

three months old. At that time he began to experience seizures—many and severe—resulting in major brain damage. Lois Angel was the size of a nine month old child. He could not hold his head up; he could not maintain a sitting position; he could not crawl; his eyes did not focus; he did have a grip and could pull himself up with some abdominal strength; he could roll over. His mother told me that she had been taught exercises to do with him and I had her demonstrate. She lovingly went through the range of motion of all the extremities. I encouraged her to continue in this manner as well as placing him

in a secure situation where he could roll and move to his liking, and to give him as much stimulation as possible. I was lost. I felt the future was pretty grim for this child. I could only think to pray to God with whom all things are possible. With the mother's permission, that's what we did. The three mothers on their knees, praying over Lois Angel.

At this time, I continue to pray for that mother and child and know that God loves them and has a purpose for all these situations that we may never understand.

My Grace is Sufficient

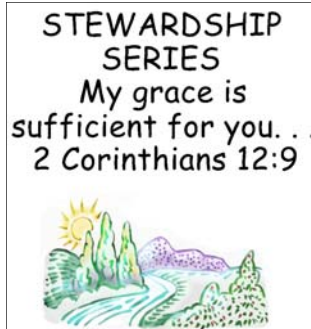

One day this week, I overheard someone in the hallway outside my office say: "Growing old ain't for sissies." A quick research on the internet reveals that this quip has been in use at least as far back as the famous vaudeville entertainer, Sophie Tucker. But the fact that it has passed into common usage goes to show just how true it is. Because it reflects the experience of so many people, it is repeated again and again.

For all of those who suffer various ailments and frustration with the process of growing old or other difficulties we have a friend in the apostle Paul.

Paul tells us in II Corinthians 12 that far from wishing them away, we should see our weaknesses and ailments as opportunities for God to become a more active presence in our lives. He says, "To keep me from becoming conceited because of these surpassingly great revelations, there was given me a thorn in my flesh, a messenger of Satan, to torment me. Three times I pleaded with the Lord to take it away from me. But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness."

We are never told what exactly this "thorn in the flesh" was for Paul. But clearly it was something that reminded him on a daily basis that he was not



self-sufficient—that it was God and not his great intellect or eloquence that granted him the authority to speak on behalf of Christ. Because of this, Paul reminds us that while we certainly may pray for relief from the pains and difficulties of life, we can also find in them cause for rejoicing in the sustaining presence of God.

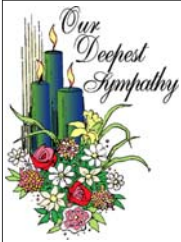
"How is this about Stewardship?", you ask. After all, when we are asked to fill out the Stewardship-In-Action forms listing our talents and interests, we are asked to talk about what we are "good" at and not what we are "bad" at. However, when we are honest with ourselves, we will admit that much of our "abilities" or "interests" are a result of struggling with or overcoming our dis-abilities - our weaknesses - our "trials and tribulations." So the next time you find yourself using your aches and pains as an excuse for not answering the call to service, remember the Apostle Paul, and "present your bodies as a living sacrifice" (Rom. 12:1), because God wants all of who we are for the work of the Kingdom. We need not be perfect to serve because God's grace is sufficient.
