## A New Year's Message from Pastor Jenny

Have you ever seen a person looking at a group photograph in which he or she is a member? They search to find themselves in the photograph. We all do it. One concern motivates our search: "How did I look?"

Here is a similar game with another picture. It may prove to be disturbing. I hope it is also meaningful.

The picture is a large painting by Robert Haydon of Christ entering Jerusalem. This is how the painting is described in a biography of the English Romantic poet John Keats.

"Christ's Entry into Jerusalem, now in St. Mary's Seminary, Norwood, Ohio, shows Christ riding on an ass, and closely surrounded by a throng of people. In imitation of the Old Masters, Haydon put in figures of more recent historical persons. Voltaire, the hero of liberal free-thinkers in his day, and the devil of the orthodox, was painted in as a smiling scoffer; Sir Isaac Newton as a believer; William Hazlitt as a detached observer; Wordsworth as a devout man; and John Keats, a bright amazed face in the background."

As we enter a new year, take some time to reflect on Christ in our world and his cause in the world. Then think of yourself and your actions and attitudes. How would you find yourself in the painting? What would best represent your habitual actions? Would you be a "smiling scoffer" or a "detached observer"? Would there be "bright amazement" in your face? Then ask yourself how you would like to be represented this time next year? You can be that person. The New Year provides an opportunity to be born again, to make the changes necessary to become a new you. Remember the words of Jesus who said, "For mortals it is impossible, but with God all things are possible" (Matthew 19:26). It's going to be a great year.

On Sunday, December 11, the CLC Congregation approved a plan to raise funds for a new sanctuary sound system. Health Tip of the Month - Sue Gauerke, Contributor**

Please note we have a medical supply cabinet to help you when you need items. We have wheel chairs, walkers with a seat, walkers with and without wheels, commodes, toilet riser, tub transfer bench, quad cane, etc.

We have an ample supply of what we think you would need, so though we appreciate donations, we are limited in our storage space and do not need anything at this time.

Just ask Vickie and she will direct you to where the storeroom is located. Please sign the sheet on the wall with what you are taking and the date. Also when you return an item mark it off the list. If you

have any supplies longer than a month, please come back and indicate that you still are in need. In this manner, we can have what is needed without storing excess.

If you are having a surgery that may require a medical item, plan ahead and maybe we can help Medicare save some money on items that are readily available.

Remember we do blood pressure and pulse oxygen readings during coffee hour on the second Sunday of the month - unless we have something special going on and are unable to set up.

## Community Service Opportunities

The **Barrel Ministry** for the month of January will be collecting non-perishable food items, paper products, and cleaning supplies for the Bread of Life Rescue Mission. Items needed include Styrofoam plates, saucers, and bowls, 16 oz. plastic cups, 39-gallon & 13-gallon garbage bags, cleaning supplies, Ziploc freezer storage bags (all sizes), Large coffee filters (Bunn), toilet paper, dish soap, aluminum foil, hand sanitizer, canned vegetables, canned fruits, spaghetti sauce and noodles, peanut butter, jellies & jams, dry beans, pre-sweetened Kool-aid, rice, instant mashed potatoes, and canned meats.

The meal for the **Bread of Life Mission** is scheduled for Sunday January 8, 2012, at 12:30

p.m. The sign-up sheet is on the Service Bulletin Board and two volunteers are necessary to be the servers at the mission and of course others are needed to prepare and supply the food for the meal. I can think of no better way to serve your fellow men and women than by furnishing the food to nourish their bodies.

I would like to expand the members on the Service Committee, to bring to it new ideas on serving those in our community. Please consider and search your heart as this committee is one that will warm your heart.

## The Second Greatest Commandment

The ELCA issue of justice is an advocacy issue whereby they urge us to address unjust issues with our elected officials. At CLC, we have encouraged advocacy through The Bread Squad.

In Tennessee, we pay a sales tax of 9.75% on virtually everything; and, while we don't like this high rate we also recognize that because Tennessee is a tourist state, visitors contribute a great deal to the Tennessee economy, thereby allowing us to enjoy lower real estate taxes and no state income tax (for most Tennesseans).

We have read a lot lately about regressive taxes (those that impact the poor to a greater extent than they impact the average person or the wealthy). The sales tax on groceries is the most regressive tax we can imagine; tax on the very necessities of life. At present, the state of Tennessee and Cumberland County assess a tax on groceries in Cumberland County at 6.5%.

It is time to take a stance on the taxation of groceries in Tennessee to help the poorest of our citizens to obtain the sustenance they require at a

My personal suggestions are to increase the sin taxes (alcohol and tobacco), increase the tax on gasoline (as a special 5 cent assessment) and to increase the overall sales tax to 10% (who are we kidding with 9.75%, this is not a fuel pump!).

## No Longer 50 . . . Graceful Aging

### Stephen Ministry - from Tom Dugan, a Stephen Minister

It's been some years since I was fifty, the memories are there, but sometimes it takes a while to recover them. When I looked at this title, the first things that came to mind were the years before fifty. The growing up years, sitting on the floor memorizing prayers while my mother cooked dinner on a coal stove, learning the Ten Commandments and the Lord's Prayer, even in public school! Things sure have changed. Those years were full of wonder, learning what to do AND, what not to do. Corporal punishment was not cruelty as it is portrayed now, it stretched your skin to help it grow. Then there were the years when we were indestructible, not very smart sometimes, but we learned. Weekly Catechism, Sunday Church, Altar Boy, piano and tap lessons, Boy Scouts, work at various jobs, and the National Guard. Then suddenly, I was an adult, or so I was classified.

Many changes occurred during this time. Young neighbors and school classmates died, showing me we were not the indestructible beings we thought.

We asked God, Why? We sometimes thought we knew the answers. Parents divorced, romantic relationships developed, parents and other friends passed on, marriage and children, divorce and remarriage with more children, and the loss of one child. The one constant in all this was God. He was always there to talk to, to dump on, be mad at, and to console in sometimes unusual ways. Knowing I was never alone was a comfort. However, God and the Holy Spirit on occasion would prod me to do something else with what He gave me. It wasn't always something I had on my priority list, but I had learned to listen more and not fight Him so much. Fortunately, He has more patience than I do. All of this has not been as graceful as it could have been, but it has been Grace Filled. God has taught me not to be so bull headed and to relax and let Him help me through the next years and whatever He has planned.
